REPORT OF FACTUAL FINDINGS

We have performed the procedures agreed with you to report factual findings for the purpose of assisting you in assessing the accuracy, security and purity of certain metal holdings. The procedures performed are detailed in the terms of the engagement letter dated 8 June 2026 and described below.
